



VISIT SHR PSHIRE

Shrewsbury is Shropshire's county town and birthplace of Charles Darwin, encircled by a meandering loop of the River Severn. Discover distinctive churches, Shrewsbury Castle, beautiful timber-framed houses and a riverside parkland known as The Quarry.

Ironbridge Gorge, birthplace of the industrial revolution and now a UNESCO World Heritage site, is home to the world-famous iron bridge and ten living history museums.
